Colleges Boast 9 Percent First-Year Enrollment Growth

First-year enrollment in the twenty-three colleges of osteopathic medicine and three branch campuses enrolling students this year is 4,408 compared with 4,055 in 2006 (an increase of 9 percent). This growth mainly reflects enrollment of 402 first-year students at three new colleges and planned growth at several others.

Total fall 2007 enrollment in the 23 osteopathic medical colleges and three branch campuses is 15,586. This is an increase of 8 percent over fall 2006 enrollment. This overall growth reflects the new colleges, the maturation of three colleges that are still adding classes, and planned growth at several others. These numbers are preliminary and will be confirmed in AACOM’s annual survey.
