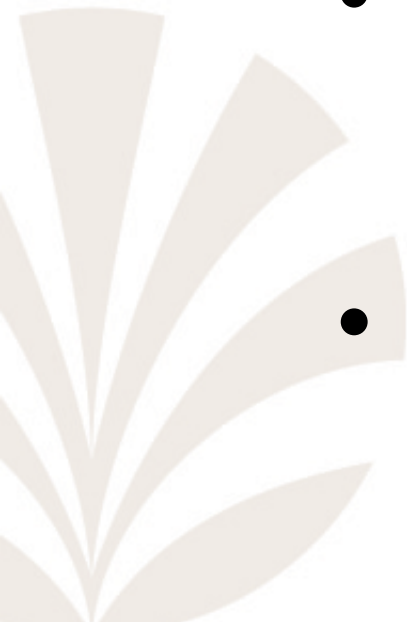

# Parkview Medical Center

# Parkview Medical Center


- Things we will require as part of OR:
  1. Every H&P must have an osteopathic exam
  2. Every outpatient must have one complete osteopathic exam annually
  3. Every resident will be required to participate in journal club which includes a JAOA article per quarter








# Parkview Medical Center

- Things we will require as part of OR:
    4. All Residents will rotate through the OMM Consult service.
    5. All residents will be checked off annually on some basic OMM techniques.
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# Parkview Medical Center

- Things we will require as part of OR:
    6. All residents will be expected to accurately document osteopathic exams and treatments and to be able to bill correctly.
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# Parkview Medical Center

- Things we will require as part of OR:
  7. Residents will be encouraged to evaluate their patients as a “whole person” and not a combination of systems.




# Parkview Medical Center

- Things we will require as part of OR:
  8. We train residents to consider issues of culture, religion, gender, sexual orientation, and mental and physical disabilities. Appropriate alternative and techniques are taught when able/available.





# Parkview Medical Center

- Challenges faced
    1. Faculty development in OPP/OMM
    2. Ensuring my MD faculty are qualified to oversee OMM/OPP
    3. Ensuring all 30 residents have an opportunity to teach or present
