- Not showing enough interest in the program


Being too modest

Part 1: Who I Am


Part 2: Why I'm Qualified

Mistake #2:


Not showing enough interest in the program


Being too modest





Mistake #4:


Not being prepared for "red flag" questions

Behavioral question answer formula:


S/T – Situation/Task
A little bit of context/backstory

A – Approach
What did you do? What skills did you use?

R – Results

What was the outcome? Concrete results, learning/growth, feedback
