	and in program participation as a presenter or	
	lecturer; and SECONDARILY must have	
	supported the osteopathic profession while	
	active in a medical specialty area and/or a	
	professional occupation/career related to	
	osteopathic medicine/medical education, and in	
	osteopathic fields outside of the AOGME.

	AOGME for the last five (5) consecutive years, or	
	for a total of at least eight (8) years, including the	
	year in which the application is made.	
2.2	Must have held a leadership, administrative, or	
	faculty position with a residency program or	
	accredited sponsoring institution that includes	
	osteopathic trainees or with a college of	
	osteopathic medicine in a role that directs or	
	supports graduate medical education and	
	training for the number of years counted in 2.1.	
2.3	Must have attended at least three (3) of the	
	AACOM/AOGME meetings for each of the years	
	counted in 2.1.	
2.4	Must have served on the AOGME Board for a	
	minimum of one (1) term; served on an AOGME
