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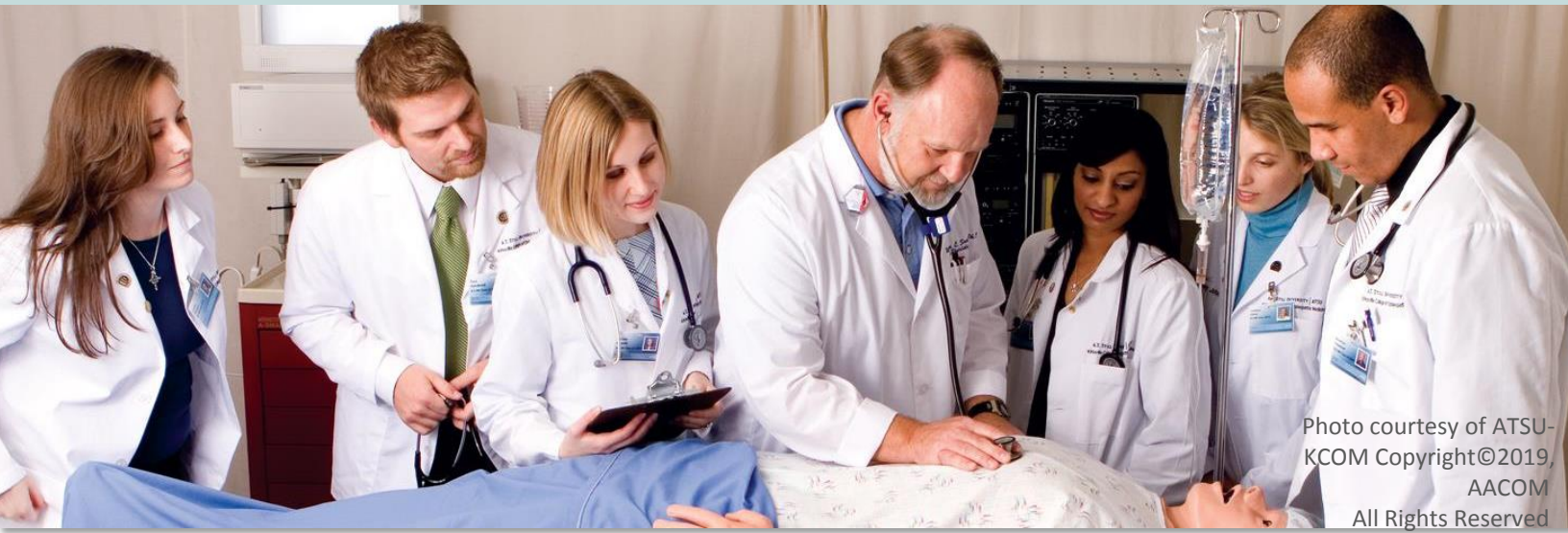

2019 AACOMAS Applicant Pool Profile Report Abstract

Each year, the American Association of Colleges of Osteopathic Medicine (AACOM) summarizes the information entered by applicants into their osteopathic medical school application. This report describes the characteristics of applicants for the class entering in 2019 who applied to the 40 osteopathic medical schools and branch campuses which participated in AACOMAS. The application cycle opened in May 2018 and closed in April 2019, with deadlines varying by college of osteopathic medicine (COM).

The applicants in this report are verified by the AACOM Application Service (AACOMAS). Due to rounding, not all percentages will total 100 in the tables below.

□ Applicant Characteristics

- AACOMAS received 193,119 individual school applications from 21,584 applicants for 7,672¹ American Osteopathic Association (AOA) Commission on Osteopathic College Accreditation (COCA)-approved seats in Fall 2018. This represents an increase of 603 (2.8%) applicants and an increase of 11,159 (5.8%) applications compared to 2018.
- There are 2.81 applicants for each COCA-approved seat in the first-year class, an decrease of .06, compared to 2.87 in 2018.
- The mean number of individual school applications per applicant is 8.9, an increase of 0.2 since 2018.
- In 2019, Female applicants represent 52.6% of the applicant pool, an increase of 1.3% since 2018. It is notable that since 2007, females have represented a little less than half of the applicant pool and 2019 data shows the largest documented proportion of female applicants to osteopathic medical schools.
- The mean applicant age of 24 remains unchanged from 2018.
- A total of 505 (2.6%) applicants had military experience.
- For the single race/ethnicity category, the percentage of under-represented minorities increased by 0.6%, from 16.4% in 2018 to 17% in 2019. Whites and Asians continue to make up more than 75 percent of the applicant pool.

□ Baccalaureate Degree Majors

- Applicants with a major categorized as life sciences are 74.3% of the applicant pool, an increase of 0.9% compared to 2018. The remaining percentages are as follows: social sciences (9.9%), physical sciences (6.2%), arts & humanities (5.1%), other majors (3.3%), and no major (0.2%). A total of 290 applicants did not report major.

□ GPA

- Post-baccalaureate overall mean GPA is the highest reported at 3.63, followed by graduate at 3.59, all-coursework at 3.48, cumulative undergraduate at 3.47, and baccalaureate at 3.46. The standard deviation for each of these categories ranged from .35 to .45.
- In 2019, science, non-science, and overall baccalaureate mean GPA increased by .03, .02, and .03 respectively, compared to 2018.
- Females continue to have a higher non-science and overall mean GPAs compared to males.
- Nonresident alien applicants' overall undergraduate mean GPA was 3.55—the highest compared to all other single category race/ethnicities.

□ MCAT Scores

- The mean scores for the new MCAT are as follows:
 - Psychological, social, and biological foundations of behavior: 126.31 (increased by 0.29 from 2018)
 - Biological and biochemical foundations of living systems: 125.75 (increased by 0.11 from 2018)

¹The University of North Texas Health Sciences Center at Fort Worth/Texas College of Osteopathic Medicine and NYIT-COM's émigré program applicants are not included in this analysis because the data are not part of the AACOMAS database. UNTHSC/TCOM receives its applications through the Texas Medical and Dental School Application Service.

Feeder Colleges	– Based on the primary undergraduate college in the AACOMAS application.
Citizenship	– Applicants select their citizenship status from four pre-defined fields in the AACOMAS application.
Country/State	– Based on the permanent state/providence and country listed in application.
Visas	– Applicants indicate if they hold a visa and the type of visa they hold.
Dual Citizen	– Applicants indicate whether they are a dual citizen and to which other country they hold a dual citizenship.

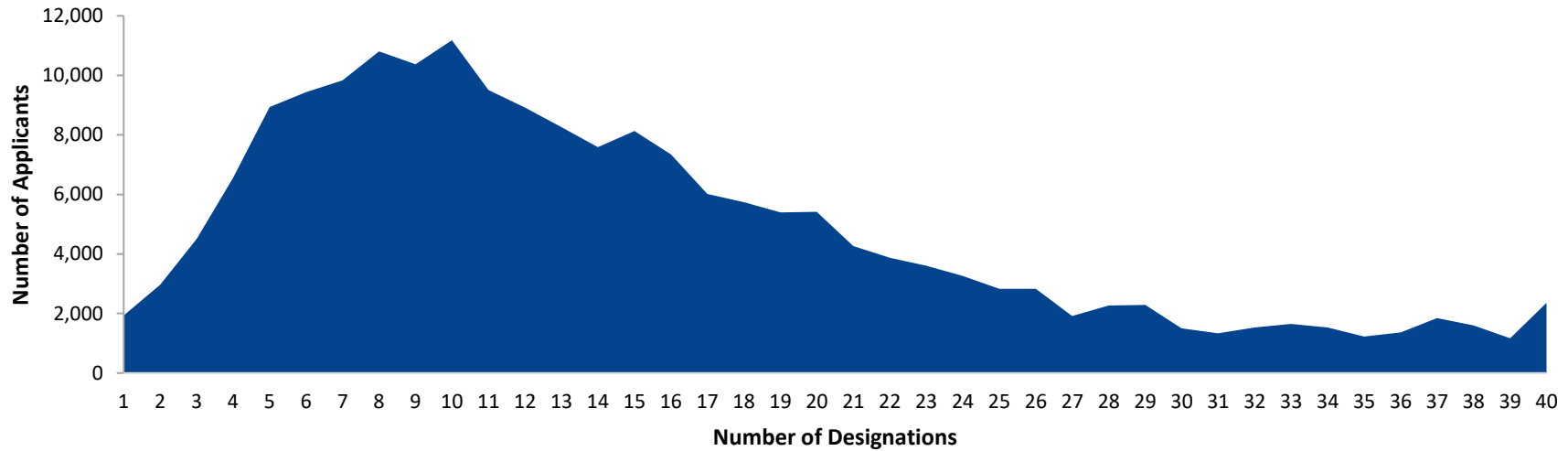


Figure 2: Race/Ethnicity – Single Category Response

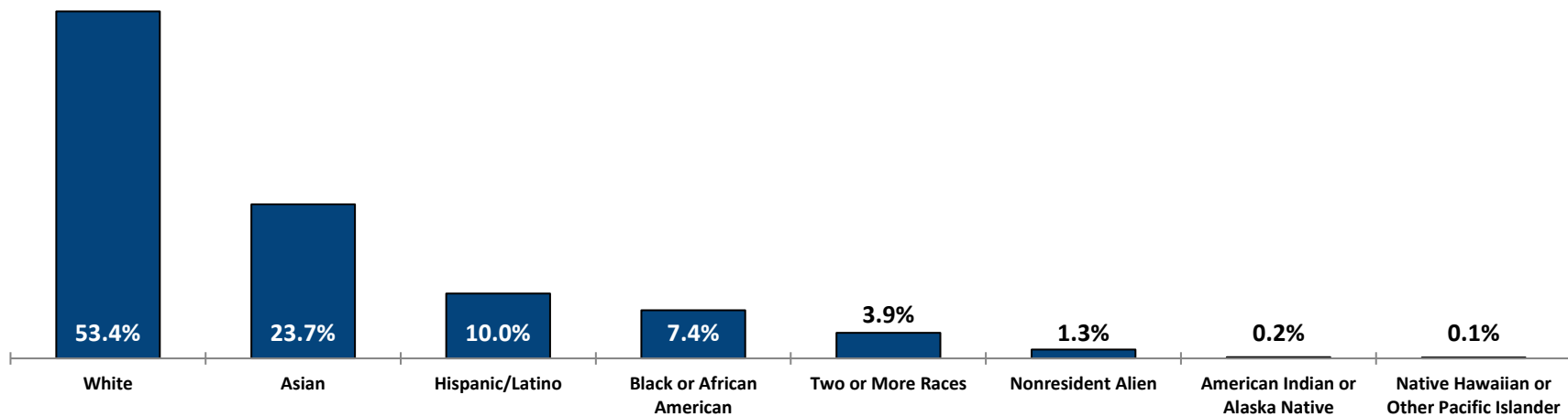


Figure 3: Race/Ethnicity by Gender – Single Category Response

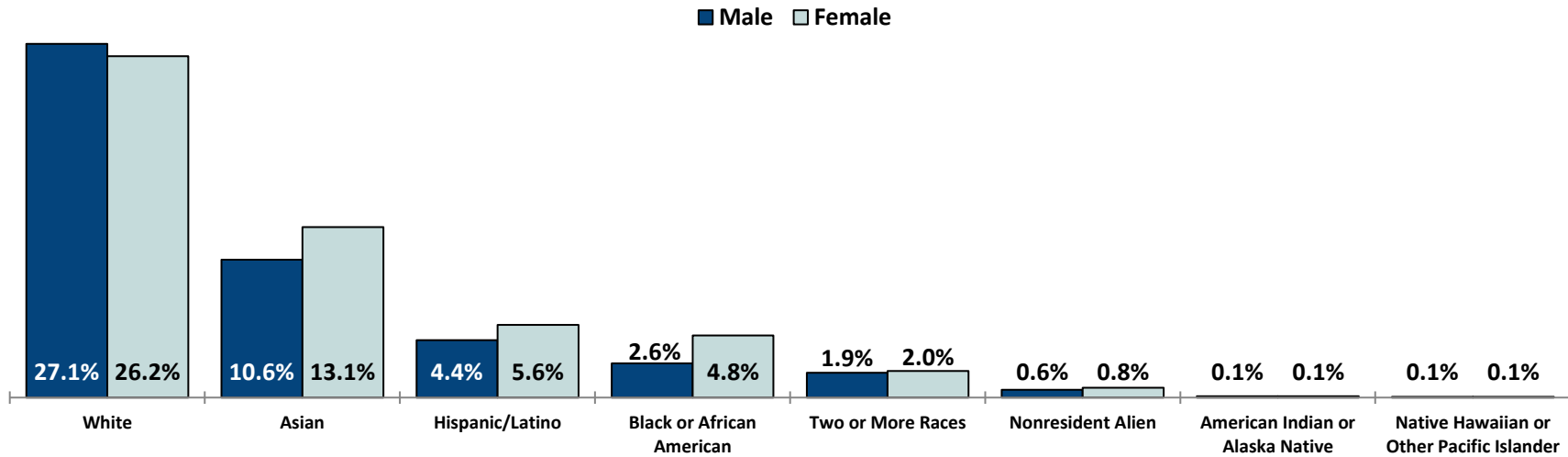


Figure 4: Baccalaureate Degree Major - First Degree from Primary College

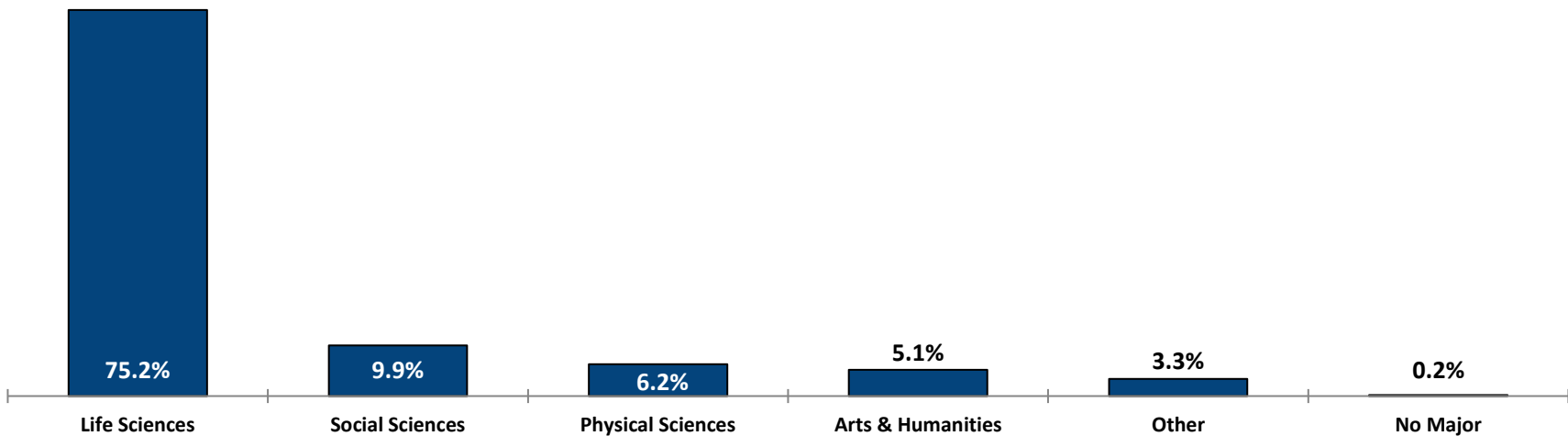


Figure 5: Overall GPA by Academic Levels

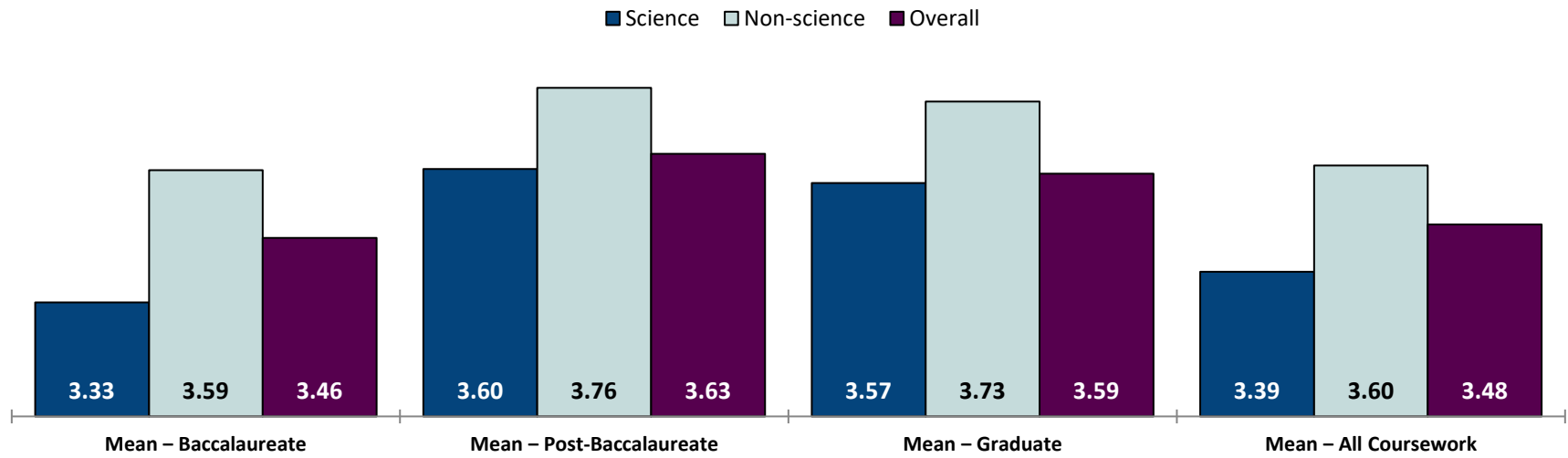


Figure 6: Undergraduate GPA Range - Percent

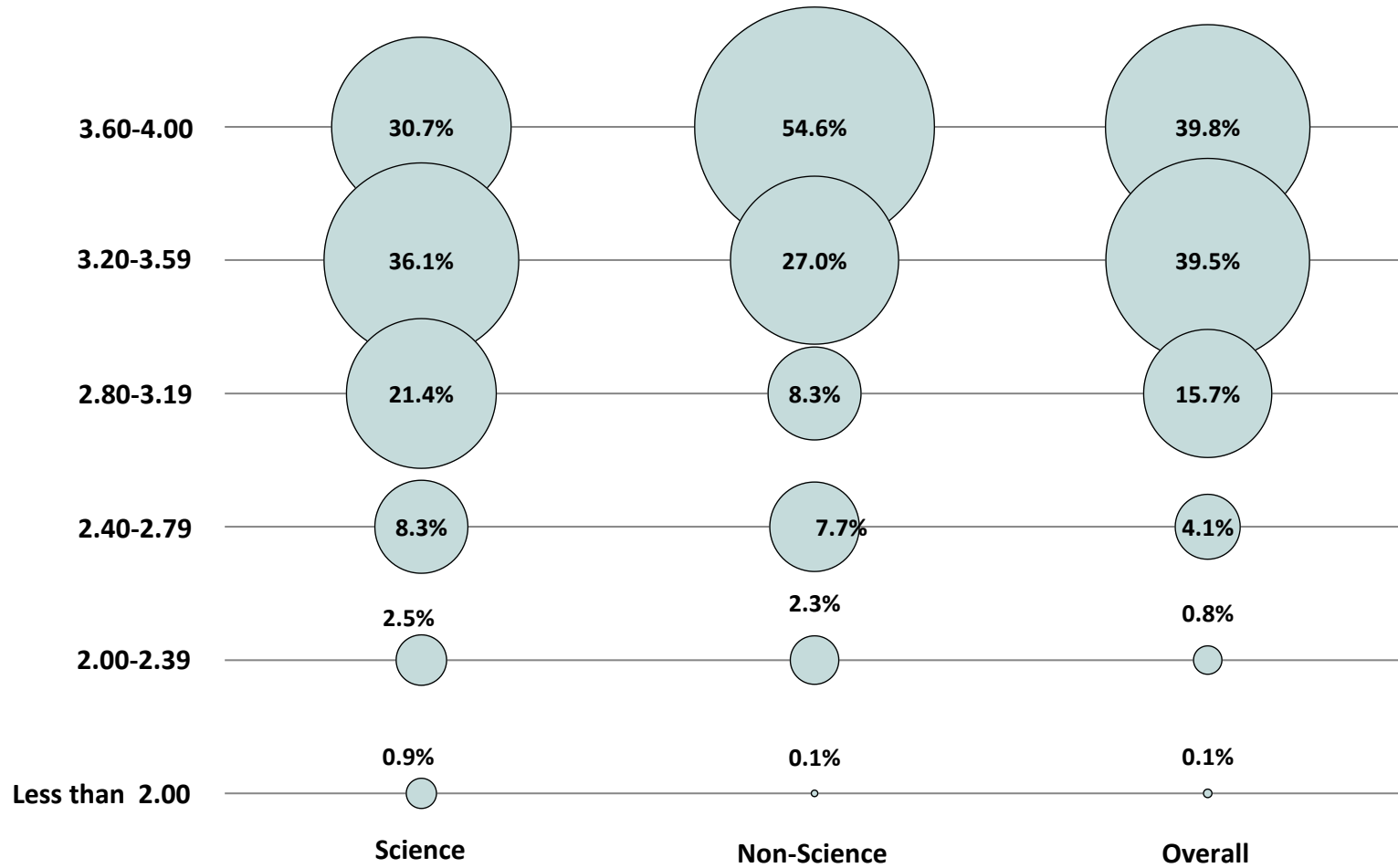


Figure 7: Mean Undergraduate GPA by Gender

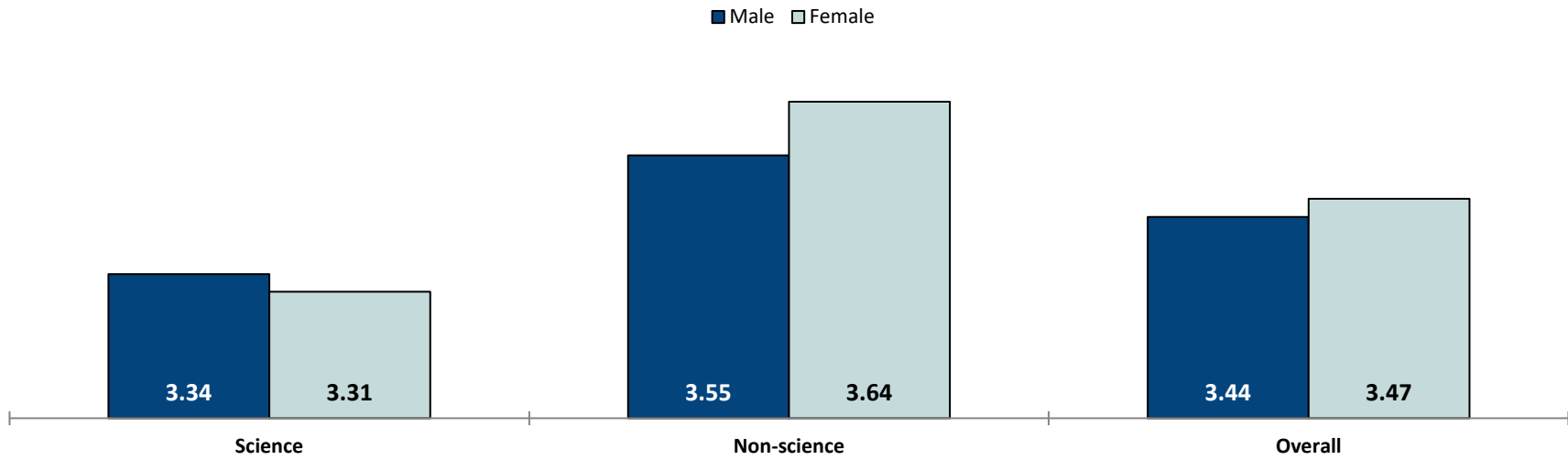


Figure 8: Mean New MCAT Section Scores

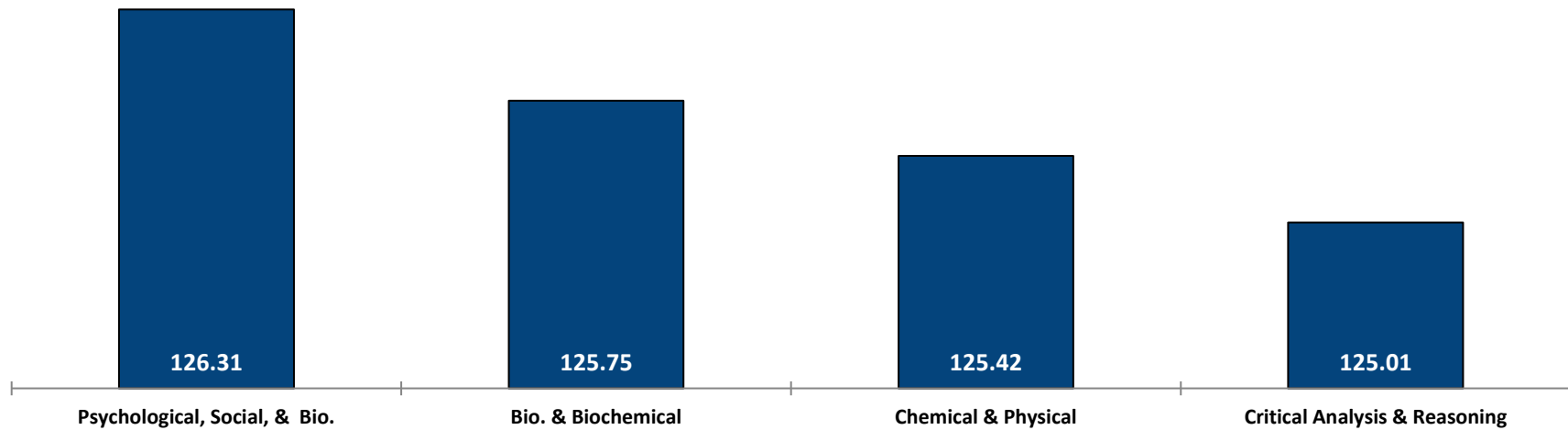


Figure 9: Mean MCAT Section Scores by Gender

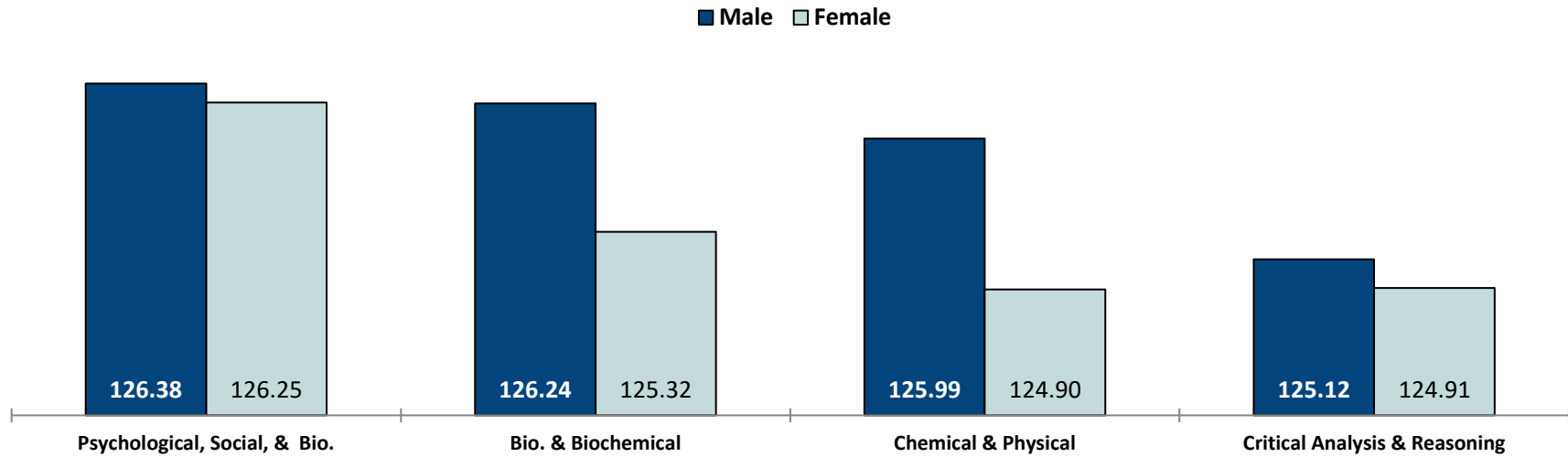


Figure 10: Met With or Heard Presentation on Osteopathic Medicine

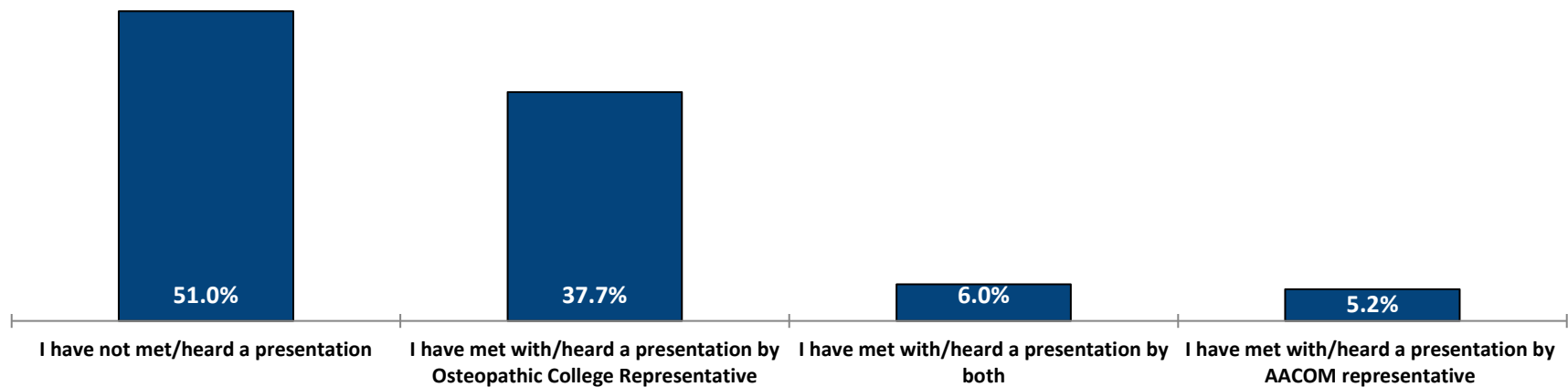


Figure 11: First Learned About Osteopathic Medicine

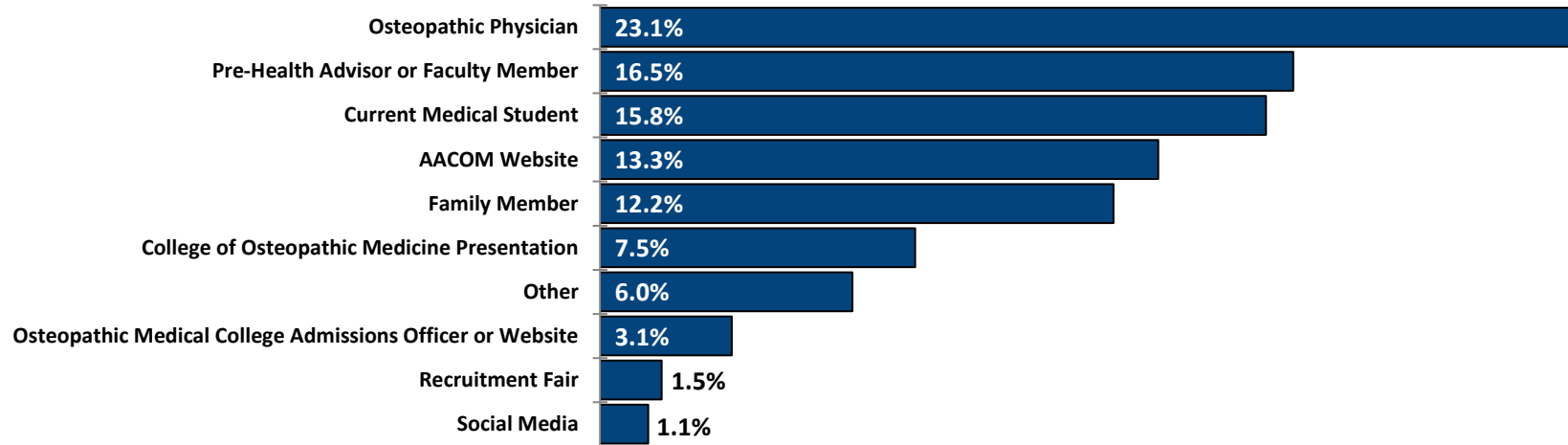


Figure 12: Previously Matriculated to Health Care Profession School - Type

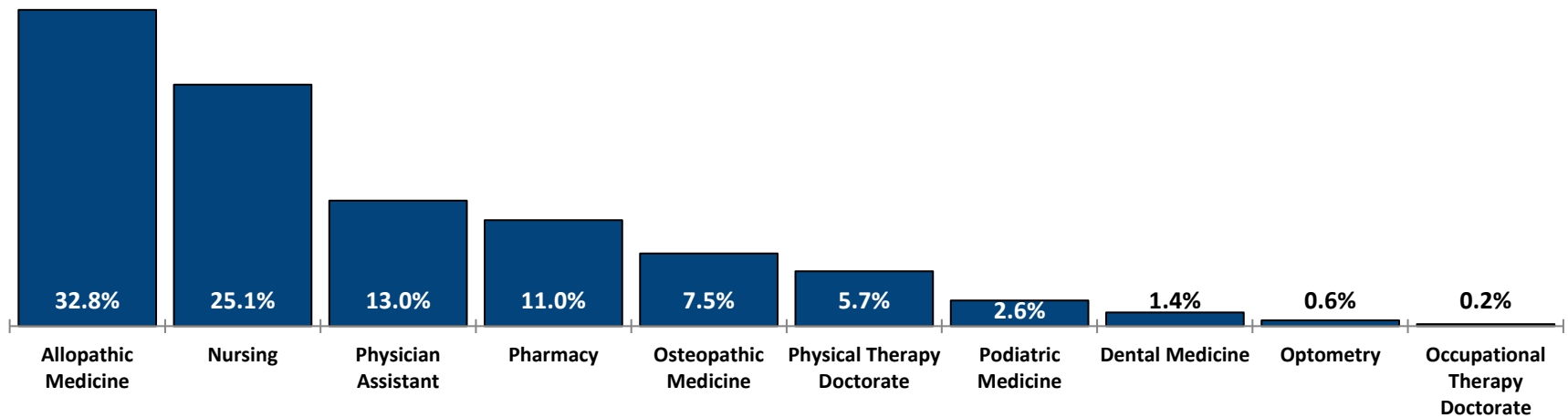


Figure 13: HRSA Geographic Region

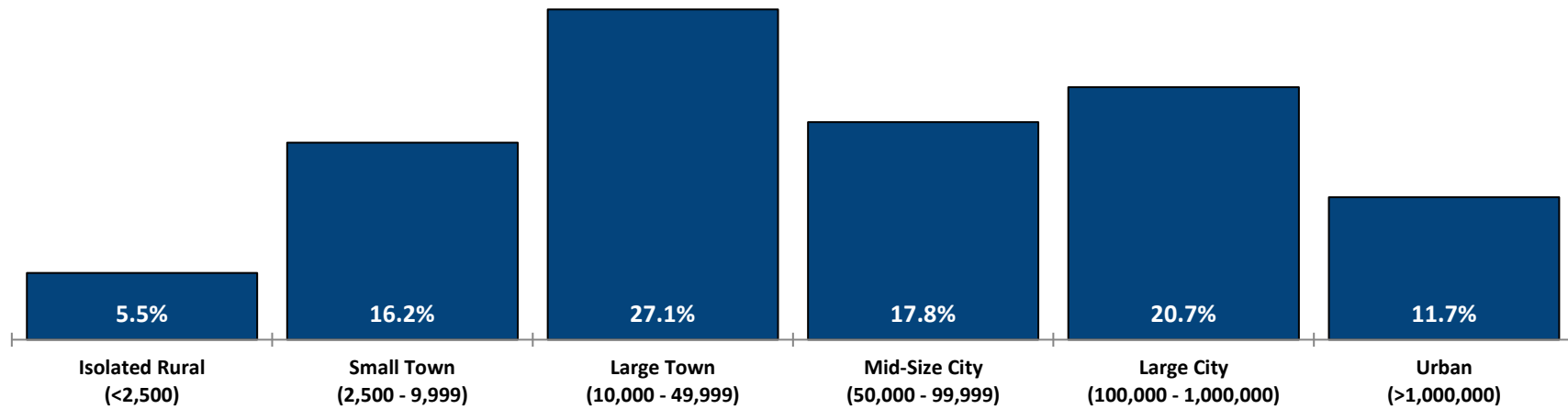


Figure 14: Type of Visa Held
