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The following are summary tables of osteopathic medical school applicants and matriculants from the 2022 entering class (2022-23 academic year). The application cycle opened in May 2021 and closed in April 2022, with deadlines varying by U.S. College of Osteopathic Medicine (COM). Due to rounding, not all percentages will total 100 in the tables below. Applicant and matriculant data are based on the information in Liaison's WebAdMIT.

The data points included in this report are as follows.

1. Applicant and Matriculant Characteristics¹

- A total of 23,488 applicants and 8,636 matriculants are included in this report. These applicants submitted 216,198 individual school applications and the matriculants submitted 92,911 individual school applications.
- The mean number of individual school applications per applicant was 9.20 and per matriculant was 10.77.
- Women represented more than half of the applicant pool (57.4%) and matriculant pool (54.7%).
- The mean age was 23 for both applicants and matriculants.
- For the single race/ethnicity category, the percentage of under-represented minorities is 17.5 percent for applicants and 12.0 percent for matriculants.

2. Baccalaureate Degree Majors

- Applicants with a major categorized as life sciences were 79.5 percent of the pool. The remaining
 percentages are as follows: social sciences (8.6%), physical sciences (5.4%), arts & humanities (3.3%), other
 majors (3.0%), and no major (0.1%). A total of 29 applicants reported no major and 637 applicants were
 missing a major.
- Matriculants with a major categorized as life sciences were 81.3 percent of the pool. The remaining
 percentages are as follows: social sciences (7.5%), physical sciences (5.2%), arts & humanities (3.0%), other
 majors (3.0%) and no major (<0.0%). Less than five matriculants reported no major and 194 matriculants
 were missing a major.

3. GPA

- Applicants undergraduate GPAs are as follows:
 - Non-Science: 3.65;
 - Science: 3.42;
 - Total: 3.53.
- Matriculants undergraduate GPAs are as follows:
 - Non-Science: 3.70;
 - Science: 3.49;
 - Total: 3.59.
- Women have a higher total undergraduate mean GPA compared to men, 3.51 compared to 3.55 for applicants and 3.57 compared to 3.61 for matriculants.
- Nonresident alien applicants' and matriculants' total undergraduate mean GPA was 3.62 and 3.64 respectively—the highest compared to all other single category race/ethnicities.

4. MCAT Scores

- Applicants' mean scores for the MCAT are as follows:
 - Psychological, social and biological foundations of behavior: 126.87;
 - Biological and biochemical foundations of living systems: 126.02;
 - Chemical and physical foundations of biological systems: 126.65;
 - Critical analysis and reasoning skills: 125.06;
 - Total for all sections: 503.60.
- Matriculants' mean scores for the MCAT are as follows:
 - Psychological, social and biological foundations of behavior: 127.19;
 - Biological and biochemical foundations of living systems: 126.36;
 - Chemical and physical foundations of biological systems: 125.96;
 - Critical analysis and reasoning skills: 125.26;
 - Total for all sections: 504.77.
- Women applicants and matriculants have lower total mean MCAT scores compared to men—502.67 compared to 504.84 for applicants and 505.68 compared to 504.01 for matriculants.
- Nonresident alien applicants' and matriculants' total mean MCAT score was 505.00 and 508.29 respectively—the highest compared to all other single category race/ethnicities.

5. Familiarity with Osteopathic Medicine and Prior Medical Education

- The total number of applicants and matriculants reporting having met with/heard a presentation by an osteopathic college representative, an AACOM representative or both was 8,881 (46.5%) and 3,451 (48.6%).
- The three most common ways applicants first learn about osteopathic medicine are as follows: 4,558 (19.7%) from an osteopathic physician, 4,106 (17.7%) from AACOM's website and 3,266 (14.1%) from a prehealth advisor or faculty member.
- The three most common ways matriculants first learn about osteopathic medicine are as follows: 1,761 (21.2%) from an osteopathic physician, 1,517 (18.2%) from AACOM's website and 1,094 (13.1%) from a prehealth advisor or faculty member.
- A total of 452 (1.9%) applicants and 126 (1.5%) matriculants previously matriculated to a healthcare
 profession school. Allopathic medicine was the most common type of health care profession school
 previously attended, representing 128 (0.5%) of applicants and 32 (0.4%) matriculants.

6. Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) Indicators

- A total of 6,499 (27.7%) applicants graduated from a high school at which many of the students are eligible for free or reduced lunch. Two other HRSA indicators—living in a Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA) and economically disadvantaged—are reported by 4,528 (19.3%) and 4,326 (18.4%) applicants.
- A total of 2,173 (25.2%) matriculants graduated from a high school at which many of the students are eligible for free or reduced lunch. Living in a HPSA and economically disadvantaged are reported by 1,505 (17.4%) and 1,262 (14.6%).
- Applicants living in a large town totaled 6,251 (26.6%). Nearly five percent of applicants—1,097—were from an isolated rural area.
- Matriculants living in a large town totaled 2,472 (28.6%). Nearly five percent of matriculants—418—were from an isolated rural area.

7. Feeder College

- University of California Los Angeles, University of Florida and Michigan State University East Lansing were the top three feeder colleges for applicants, together providing 1,111 (4.7%) applicants.
- University of Florida, Michigan State University East Lansing and University of California Los Angeles were the top three feeder colleges for matriculants, together providing 455 (5.3%) matriculants.

8. Visa, Citizenship and Dual Citizenship

- Approximately 95.8 percent of applicants and 96.7 percent of matriculants were U.S citizens.
- There were 6,587 (28.0%) applicants who listed their state of residence as California, Florida or New York.
- There were 2,375 (27.5%) matriculants who listed their state of residence as California, Florida or New York.
- Visas were held by 258 (1.1%) applicants and 70 (0.8%) matriculants; of these, 188 (0.8%) applicants and 49 (0.6%) matriculants held F1-student visas.
- A total of 22,290 (94.9%) applicants and 8,292 (96.0%) matriculants listed their citizenship country as the United States. Of those not reporting the United States, 322 (1.4%) applicants and 101 (1.2%) matriculants were Canadian residents.

Data Cleaning Notes

Outlined below is a description of the types of filters, manipulations and categorization of data found in this report. An asterisk indicates that the question is optional in the American Association of Colleges of Osteopathic Medicine Application Service (AACOMAS) application.

Any applicants/matriculants listing more than one race are reported as "Multiple Races" and any applicant/matriculant who marks Hispanic/Latino is counted as being of Hispanic/Latino ethnicity, effectively superseding any other race selection(s) s/he may have made; and (2) multiple category response, where each applicant/matriculant is counted for every race/ethnicity that the applicant/matriculant reported, which may result in the applicant/matriculant being counted multiple times. For the tables and figures in this report, the Multiple Races and Unknown categories do not describe option choices in the AACOMAS application, but are instead respondent behavior (e.g., multiple or missing responses). United States citizens and permanent residents are included in race and ethnicity totals, while temporary residents and non-U.S. citizens are counted in the nonresident alien category. This follows U.S. Census and IPEDS collection and reporting methodology.
